Message From The Board


The year 2020 was a unique one for Atfaluna in many ways. The coronavirus crisis wreaked havoc the world over, and it definitely posed some challenges to various aspects of our operation. Yet, our team proved its resilience and pragmatism, making the best of the difficult circumstances. First, we took advantage of the forced "down time" and did some major restructuring, from which we have already seen marked improvements in the effectiveness of our organization. It was a team effort involving all our old members, while several new members with a variety of specialties were recruited to boost our team's capacities, the whole effort being ably organized by our new Planning Officer, Eng. Muna Budairi.

Times like these require us to think of those who were hit the hardest and try to help them, and that we did by offering our services to patients who could not be operated on in the government hospitals where they had been evaluated, but where all non-COVID activities had been suspended. Thus, even though the lockdowns understandably led to a drop in the number of new evaluated cases, our assistance in lightening the government hospitals' burden raised the number of surgeries we performed compared to that of 2019. Among our other achievements were new partnerships with other organizations, one of which – "PACES Charity" – had run a coronavirus crisis-relief campaign and entrusted us in spending some of their raised funds on the treatment of needy children. Finally, given the difficulty of organizing "medical screening days" in marginalized areas, as we had done in previous years, we made agreements with local optometry centers, where patients were screened on an ongoing basis and given the services they needed free of charge as they came along.

We are very grateful to all our volunteers and donors who continue to humble us with their selflessness and generosity. Please take a look at the following pages to see the different ways we all came together in 2020 to continue serving our mission, and help us spread the word about Atfaluna by sharing this report with as many people as you can.

Transforming A Child's Future

When we met Mahmoud in 2016, he was 5 years old. He had cerebral palsy from birth, with severe weakness and spasticity in both his legs that made him totally unable to walk, let alone go to kindergarten as healthy children usually do.

Mahmoud's journey with Atfaluna began after he was referred to us by our special partner, The Shifa' Team, of Life Makers Charitable Society, who covered all of Mahmoud's treatment expenses over the years. His treatment included a number of surgeries performed expertly and free of charge by our beloved **Dr. Akram Al-Shoubaki**, and it continued over the years, with numerous sessions of intensive physiotherapy at **Al-Mustaqbal Physiotherapy Center**, as well as multiple custom-made braces provided by Medical Step.

Today, at age 10, Mahmoud walks independently and goes to school the way any healthy child does, thanks to the great team effort that is Atfaluna.

IN LOVING MEMORY OF MAHAAL-AMIR 1964-2021

The Atfaluna family recently lost one of its founding members: our beloved **Maha al-Amir**. Maha dedicated her life to helping those less fortunate, be they young or old, and her early and sudden departure was a loss to so many people, many of whom had never met her and yet were touched by her kindness. Her enthusiasm and sense of humor, not to mention her fundraising prowess, will be very hard to match, and Atfaluna owes so much of what it has become to this unique spirit.

In Maha's memory, we have established a PERMANENT FUND to which her friends and those she inspired can donate in perpetuity.

How We Work

Socio-Economic Assessment

A child's story begins with our Senior Operations Manager, who runs a detailed initial socio-economic assessment to confirm true need.

Medical Committee Evaluation

The file then moves rapidly to the next phase, which is the Medical Committee's evaluation, and if the case fulfills the medical selection criteria the child is referred for evaluation and treatment by one of our volunteer specialists. The specialists we work with are among Jordan's best, as we strongly believe our children should receive the same level of care accessible to any more fortunate child.

Fundraising

Once the evaluating physician draws up the child's treatment plan, it is our fundraising committee's turn to raise the funds needed to make that plan a reality.



Treatment Journey

Then the treatment journey begins, and it does not end before our child's treatment and follow up have been fully completed and the child's life is as free as can be of pain and disability.



Remah, 5 years old

is a chronic kidney failure patient, who needed an urgent surgery to treat an infected dialysis catheter. The procedure was performed free of charge by

Dr. Bilal Azzam at The Specially Hospital, the generously discounted hospital bill was covered by Atfaluna, and her whole treatment journey was overseen, at no charge as always, by

Dr. Samah Jbour.



Medical Committee's Selection Method

Atfaluna aims to provide medical care for every child who needs it; yet to optimize the utilization of our finite resources our Medical Committee uses an algorithm to help us prioritize our patients in an equitable manner. This algorithm has two main stages:

Initial Screening Criteria

- Age 18 years or younger
- Fulfillment of socio-economic pre-screening criteria
- Non-malignant, non-chronic condition
- Absence of coverage by any insurance company or other NGO, unless:
 - Required treatment is unavailable in Jordan
 - Condition is urgent

Weighted Selection Criteria

- Threat to life
- Urgency of treatment
- Impact on child's quality of life
- Complication rate

The score for each case is calculated according to the above weighted items, and if the minimum total is attained, the case is selected, and the child's treatment journey begins.



How Your Donations Were Spent in 2020


One of Atfaluna's distinguishing features is that it revolves largely around volunteerism, which truly minimizes our administrative expenses – only 5.4% of our expenditure went toward administrative expenses, whereas the rest, 94.6%, went purely into patient care. Moreover, even those administrative expenses are covered by certain donors who choose specifically to cover them on our behalf.

With a few exceptions, our physicians usually waive their fees entirely, and all the hospitals and supportive medical service providers (laboratory, diagnostic imaging, etc.) with whom we work give us **generous discounts**. Naturally, this all **multiplies the value of every donated dinar**: as you can see in the following table, in 2020 the treatments that cost Atfaluna around 174,000 dinars had an estimated "original market price" of almost 481,000 dinars.

The treatments provided for our children last year included **134 surgeries** and other less-invasive interventions, as well as fitting and provision of numerous medical devices and equipment, and hundreds of wound-care and physiotherapy sessions.

Reach & Impact

In 2020, Atfaluna provided medical care for **454 children** – that is an 18.5% decrease compared to 2019. This reduction is attributed to the restrictions on movement imposed by the government during the coronavirus lockdowns. Conversely, our surgeons performed **134 surgeries**, which surpassed last year's number, due to our previously mentioned effort to lessen the burden of our colleagues in government hospitals, as they restricted their activities to treating only COVID-19 patients.



Amna, 9 years old

is a great example of the saying, "a problem defined is a problem half solved!" She suffered for a while from a variety of life-threatening symptoms without knowing their cause, until she was finally diagnosed with Adisson's disease by Dr. Nadwa Zuhluf and Dr. Seema Kalaldeh.

Thanks to them and the treatments they prescribed, Amna's life has been changed and she is now doing so much better.



Cost and Savings Per Intervention Category





Percent Expenditure Per Specialty




Number of Cases Per Specialty

Medical Screening Days

As mentioned above, the coronavirus crisis precluded organizing "Medical Screening Days" in the country's marginalized communities, as we had done in previous years. Therefore, we adapted to the circumstances and made deals with trusted optics centers located in two refugee camps: those centers screened our patients on an ongoing basis, giving the needed services free of charge, at Atfaluna's expense:

Where Did Our Funds Come From?

We greatly appreciate all our donors, as every monetary or in-kind donation, big or small, has a significant impact on a child's life.

Individuals

In 2020, we raised JOD 231,435. The Sixty-eight percent of our raised funds were from individual donations, ranging from as little as JOD 8 to as much as JOD 7,100.

As with all similar organizations, we always encourage our supporters to make regular donations, regardless of their size, as those are very helpful in our budgeting and planning. **Eighty-five of our donors made multiple donations over the course of the year**, and in 2021 we will finally have mobile and online donation capabilities enabling you to both make one-time donations and program recurring donations using your phone or computer with a click of a button.

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Our New Partnerships



The year 2020 witnessed the signing of a memorandum of understanding between Atfaluna and Abdali Hospital, by which **Abdali Hospital pledged to discount 50%** from all our children's in-patient and out-patient bills. We are very proud of this new partnership and grateful for the savings it brings us, together with the quality care for our patients and convenience for the Abdali physicians looking after them.



This inspirational organization, whose usual focus is supporting the participation of marginalized children in sports, modified its mandate during the coronavirus lockdowns and carried out an impressive fundraising campaign to support those affected by them throughout the region. Atfaluna was chosen among the beneficiaries to receive some of those raised funds – JOD 50,000 – the majority of which were utilized in 2020.



PACES Scoliosis Mission

Nour, Judy, Samia, Abdelmohsen, Arwa, Khaleel, and Israa' are seven children who suffered from severe spinal deformities from a young age. Fortunately, through this mission, they were treated with a relatively new surgical technique called "posterior tethering," which influences and corrects the spine's growth without stopping it.

The pioneering team that performed those long and risky procedures at no charge are spine specialists **Dr. Mohammad Armouti** and **Dr. Mo'taz Jadaan**, joined by orthopedist **Dr. Murad Hijjawi**, and in some cases neurosurgeon **Dr. Tareq Kan'aan**. We are very grateful to them all for offering our children that cutting-edge treatment, allowing them to move and breathe normally, thus giving them hope for a successful future.

This mission was made unique by the amount of cooperation it involved from various parties striving to bring happiness to our less-fortunate kids. The generous grant we received from **PACES** is what allowed us to fund so many such costly, high-tech procedures within a short period (as well as other similar ones in 2021). We also owe a big thank you to **Abdali Hospital**, our new partner who gave us generous discounts, as well as its amazing **team of anesthesiologists**, all of whom also waived their fees in full and played a critical role in the well-being of these patients and the success of this mission.

Dr. Iyad Ammoury – Pediatric Interventional Cardiology

Dr. Mustafa Mehyar – Ophthalmology

Dr. Mustafa has treated the largest number of Atfaluna children with eye problems to date. Not only has he performed numerous squint surgeries for our children so skillfully, but he has also negotiated on our behalf special prices from the hospitals where they are performed. Dr. Mustafa was the star surgeon of the "Sami's Eyes" Campaign we carried out in 2019 in memory of the late photographer, Sami Haven.

During 2020 Atfaluna started a restructuring and planning process for the coming three years, setting strategic goals that will hopefully enable us to more effectively fulfill our mission of giving our children access to quality medical care, ensuring that the neediest children are identified and prioritized, and increasing the number of children receiving sustained medical care to eliminate their suffering. Here are some of the specific goals we set for our various committees:

- Institutionalizing the operations of Atfaluna's different committees, and instituting systems and procedures for our daily operations, for both transparency and good practice.
- Refining the roles and responsibilities of our six working committees and strengthening the communication and cooperation channels among them.
- Boosting the capacity of our working committees with new qualified and specialized volunteers.
- Increasing and formalizing the number of agreements and memoranda of understanding with high-caliber partner organizations and medical service providers (MSPs).
- Recruiting more leading medical professionals into our pool of volunteers.
- Implementing a monitoring system, built into our new and elaborate web app, that will enable us to assess the treated child's entire treatment journey, with an impact assessment on the quality of his or her life at the end of that journey.

- Expanding our outreach strategy to better target the poverty pockets in all of Jordan's geographic regions.
- Ensuring well-organized support for our increasing number of patients and MSPs from our growing pool of volunteers.
- Growing our fundraising efforts through a two-track (individual and corporate) fundraising approach, diversified payment methods, and diversified fundraising scales (from individual case announcements to campaigns for groups of similar cases).
- Improving detailed updates to donors and demonstrating the specific impact and value of their donations.
- Creating public awareness of the Atfaluna brand across all stakeholders, building a corporate face for the brand, and nurturing gratitude communication.
- Working with all media types and levels (digital and traditional) and participating in public events and promotional activities as soon as it is possible to do so again.
