Our social workers and volunteers work hand-in-hand to assess a child's socio-economic situation and the details of his or her medical condition.

Through various fundraising events and channels, we secure the necessary financial resources to provide the child's required treatment (surgery, orthotic, medication, etc.).

We continue following and supporting the child up to the final treatment stage towards a healthier and a happier life, for as long as it takes.

HOW TO JOIN?

There are three types of volunteer opportunities:



VISITS

Visiting children before and/or after their surgeries to make them feel more at ease, and perhaps build relationships with them. Here you would be advised a few days prior to the visit and even provided with a small suitable gift to take to our little patient.



ACCOMPANIMENT

Accompanying children and their parents to their physicians' clinic visits, and helping them check into the hospital on the day of their surgery. Here the volunteer acts as a liaison between the doctor/hospital, the child's family, and the core Atfaluna volunteer.



ADMINISTRATIVE

A "behind-the-scenes", non-beneficiary (i.e. child patient or parent) role. This role's responsibilities will depend on the applicant's educational background and experience (e.g. graphic design, accounting, social media, or what have you).

We usually send messages whenever a volunteer opportunity arises, explaining the tasks we would like you to perform.

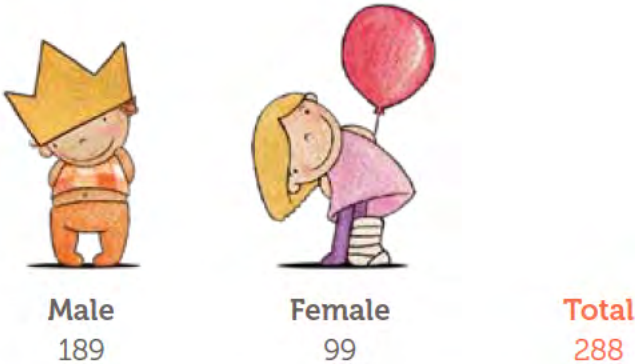

Number of cases

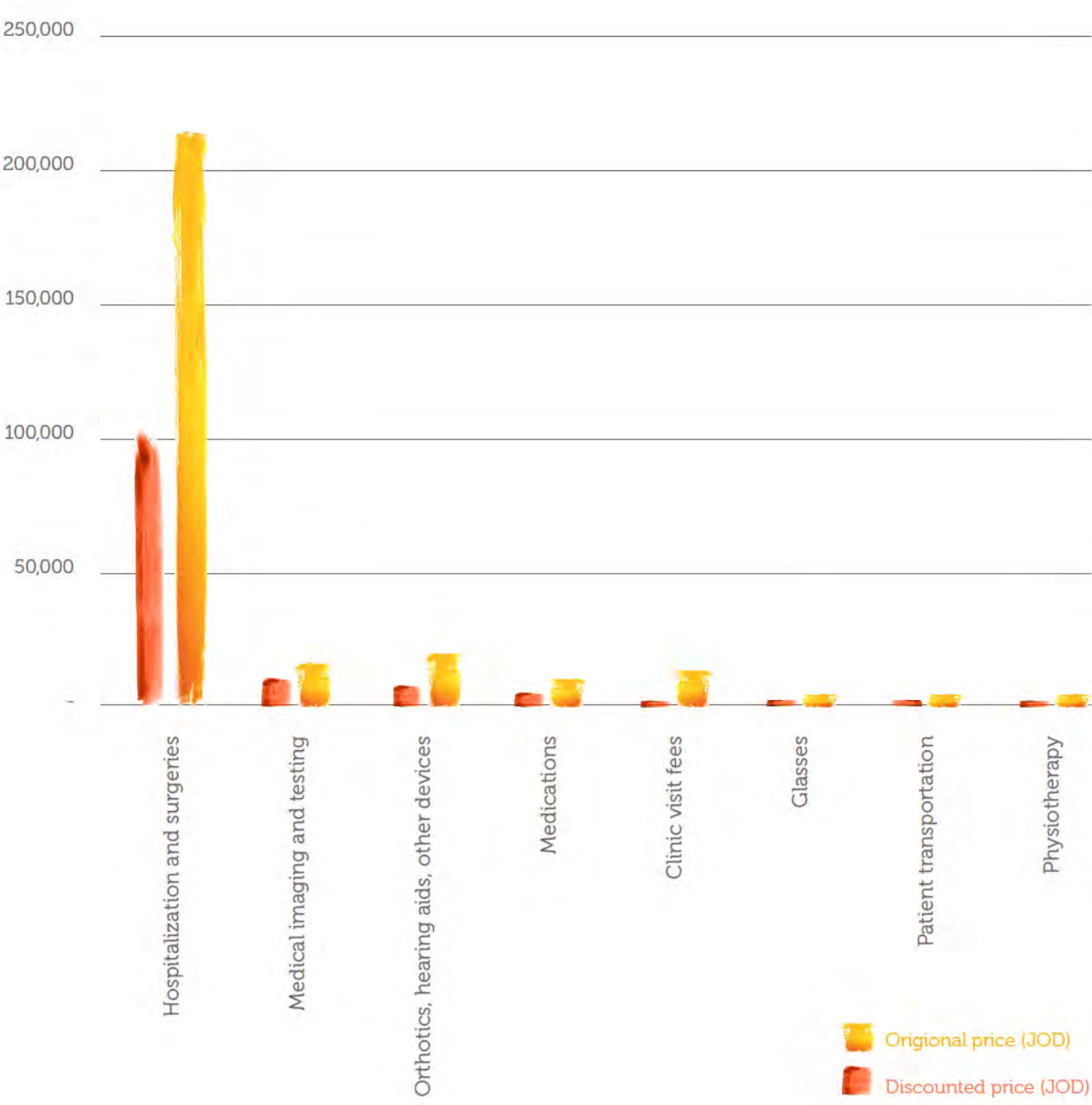
