# Atfaluna in a Glimpse

In 2015, a group of volunteers working in various professions came together and founded this non-profit organization, the name of which means "our children," with the goal of helping children receive quality treatment for medical problems that their parents cannot afford. Together, with your support and the help of a large and growing group of volunteers, we have since been able to achieve that goal successfully for thousands of children, helping assure not only their health but also their dignity and future.

## The Way We Operate

1

### Socio-Economic Assessment

A child’s story begins with our social-work team, who runs a detailed initial socio-economic assessment to confirm true need.

### Medical Committee Evaluation

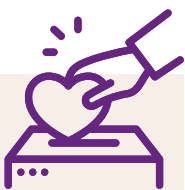
The file then moves rapidly to the next phase, which is the Medical Committee’s evaluation, and if the case fulfills its medical selection criteria the child is referred for evaluation and treatment by one of our volunteer specialists. The specialists we work with are among Jordan’s best, as we strongly believe our children should receive the same level of care accessible to any other more-fortunate child.

### Fundraising

Once the evaluating physician draws up the child’s treatment plan, it is our Fundraising Committee’s turn to raise the funds needed to make that plan a reality.

### Treatment Journey

Then the treatment journey begins, and it does not end before our child’s treatment and follow up have been fully completed and the child’s life is as free as can be of pain and disability.







# Our Patient-Selection Algorithm

Atfaluna aims to provide medical care for every child who needs it; yet to optimize the utilization of our finite resources, our Medical Committee uses the following two-step algorithm to help us prioritize our patients in an equitable manner:

## Initial Screening Criteria



Age 18 years or younger



Fulfillment of socio-economic pre-screening criteria



Non-malignant, non-chronic condition



Lack of coverage by any insurance company or other NGO, unless desired treatment is urgent and waiting period for available coverage is deemed unreasonably long

## Weighted Selection Criteria



Threat to life



Impact on child's quality of life



Urgency of treatment



Complication risk

Each criterion is assigned a weight, and the total score for each case is calculated. If the total exceeds our cutoff, the case is selected, and the child's treatment journey with Atfaluna begins.



# Who We Are

Atfaluna’s paid employees consist of our Senior Operations Manager, **Ms. Manal Shreiteh**, along with our Social Workers, **Ms. Batool Mohsen** and **Ms. Lama Al-Shalalfa**, and our Accounting & Administrative Officer, **Ms. Saja Battat**, who has taken the place of **Mrs. Muna Freij**.

Besides the critical roles played by our above salaried team, all the other tasks performed in the day-to-day planning and execution of our work are done by volunteers. Our “core team” of volunteers consists of a group of professionals with their own full-time jobs who work tirelessly, pro bono in the below-mentioned committees, together with a larger pool of “field volunteers” who eagerly step up to help out whenever help is required.

Atfaluna’s strategy is developed, and its implementation is followed up, by the Management Board, which is led by our Planning Officer, **Eng. Muna Budairi**. 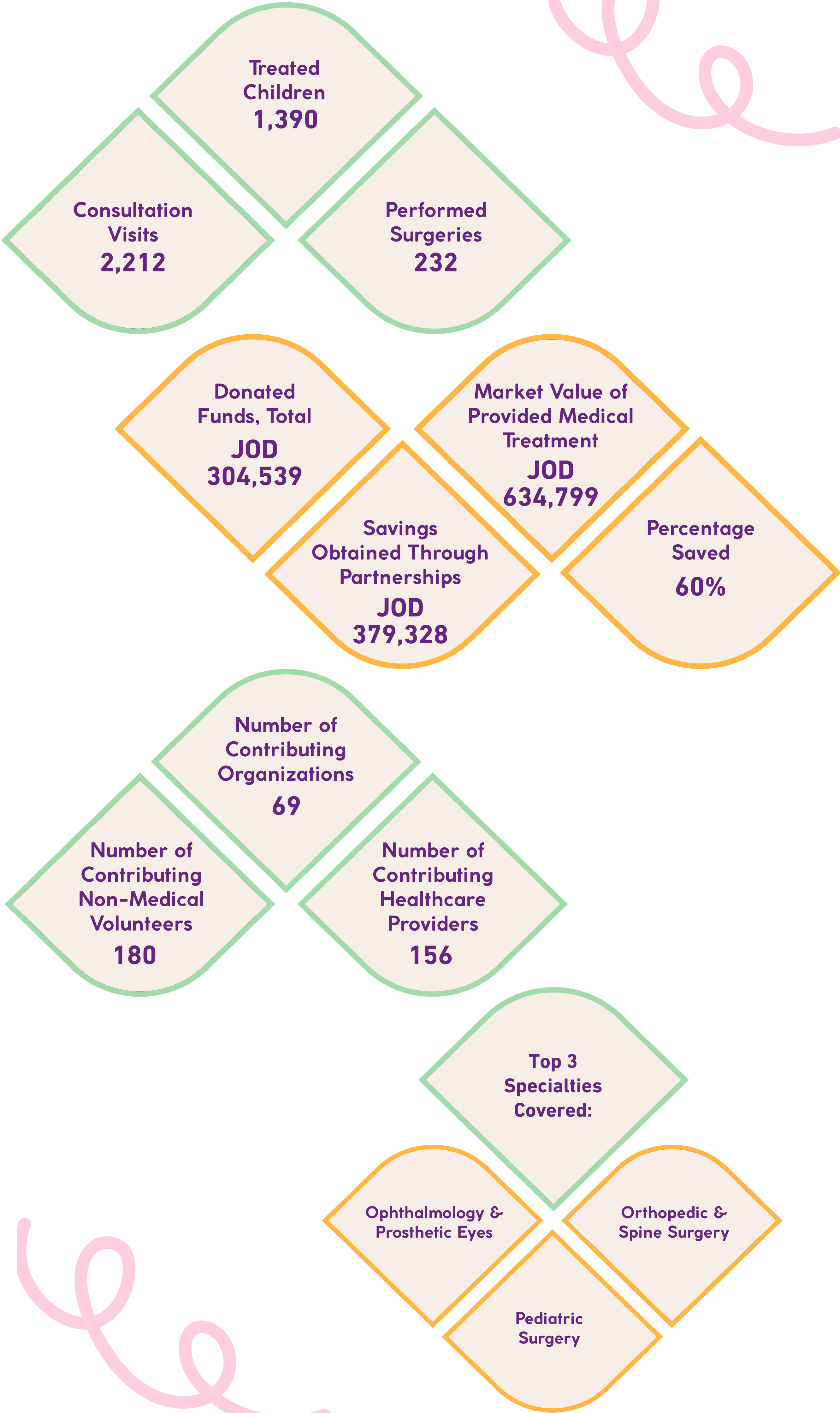

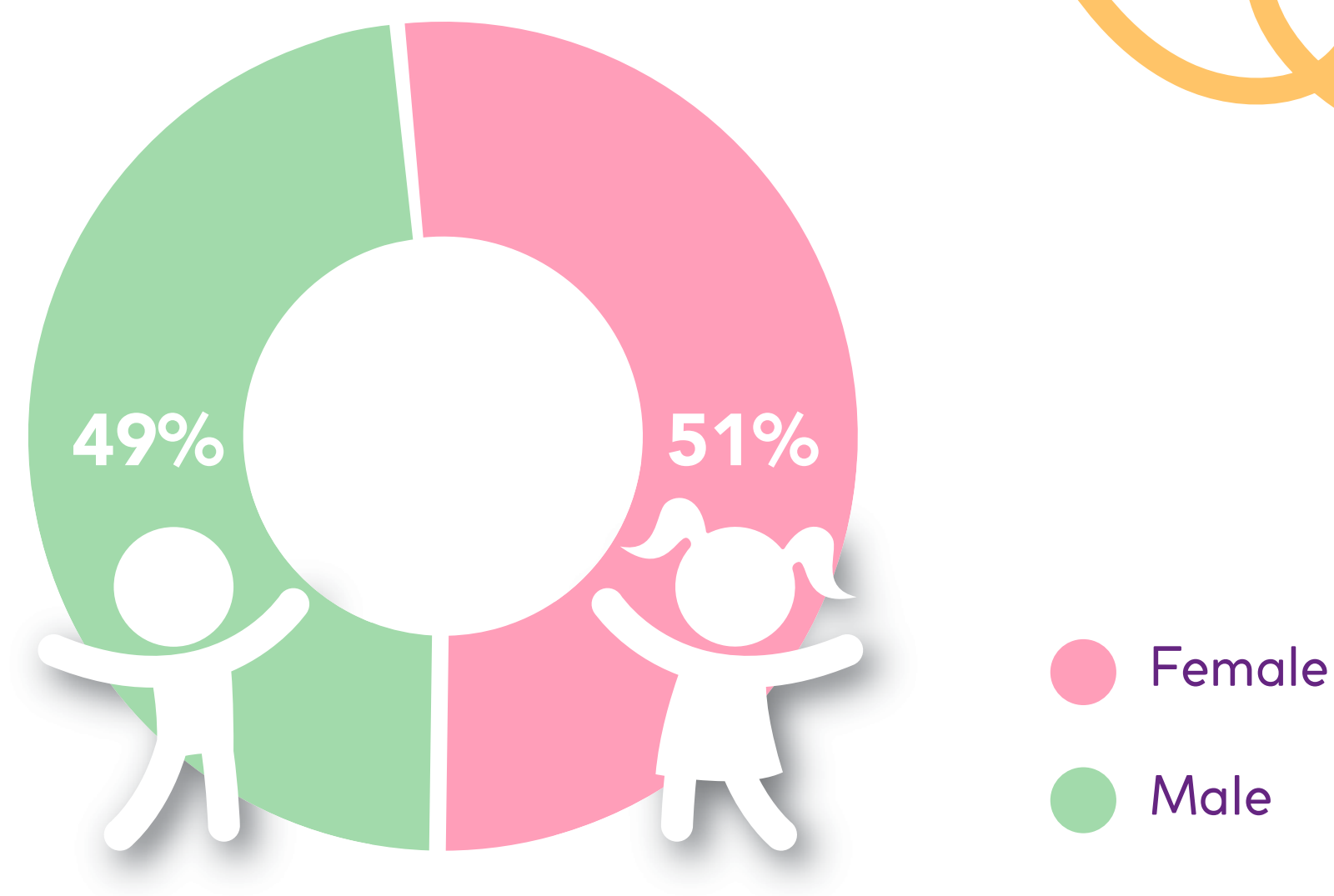

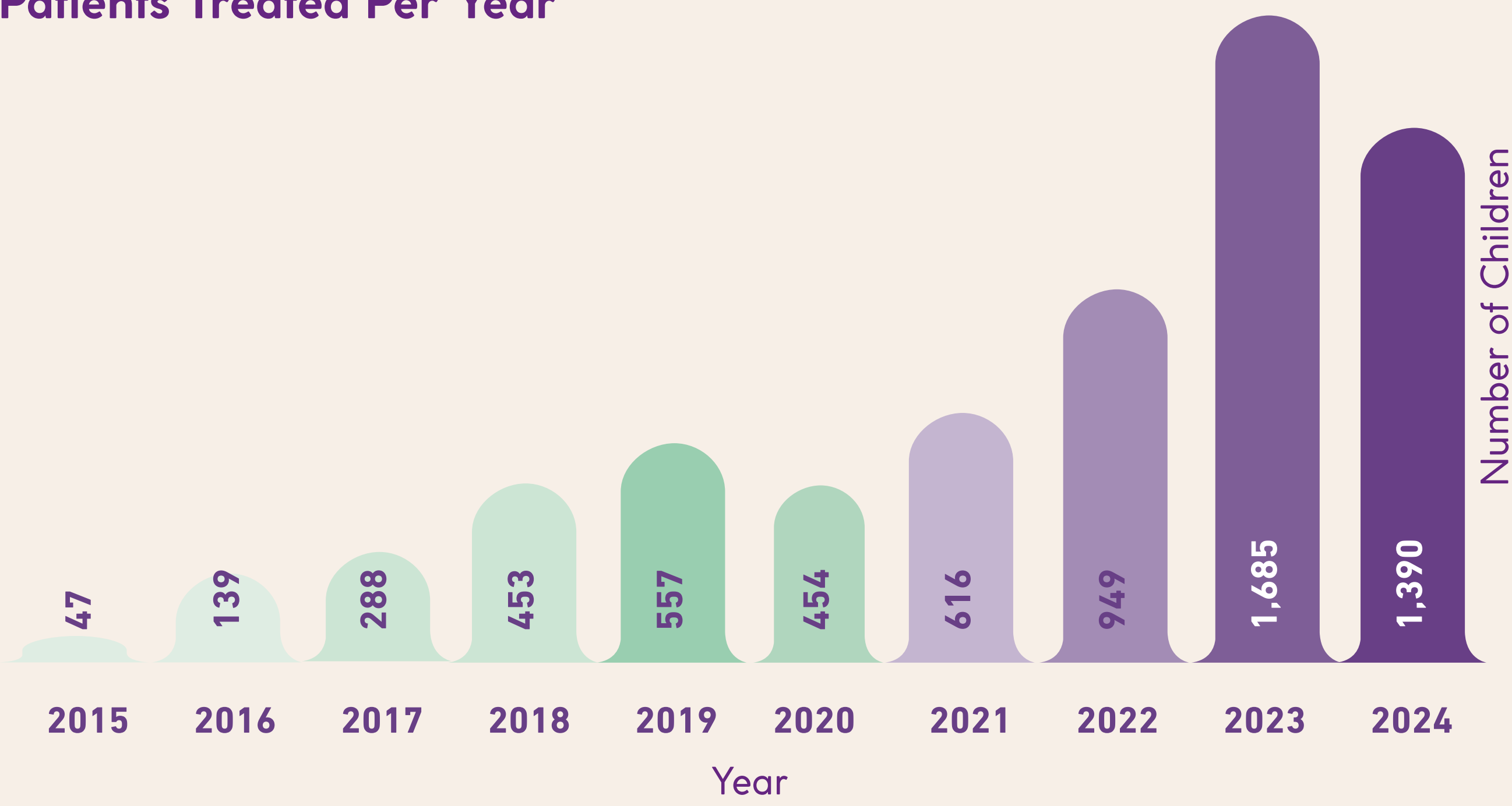
## Cases Per Gender

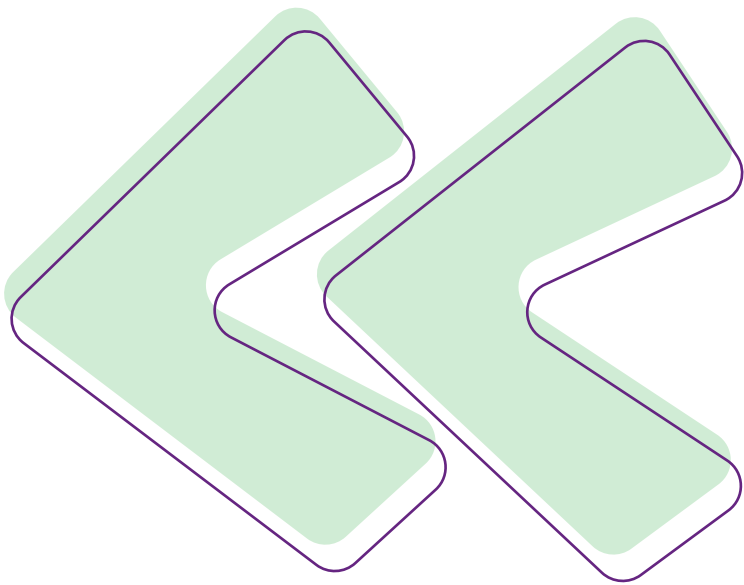

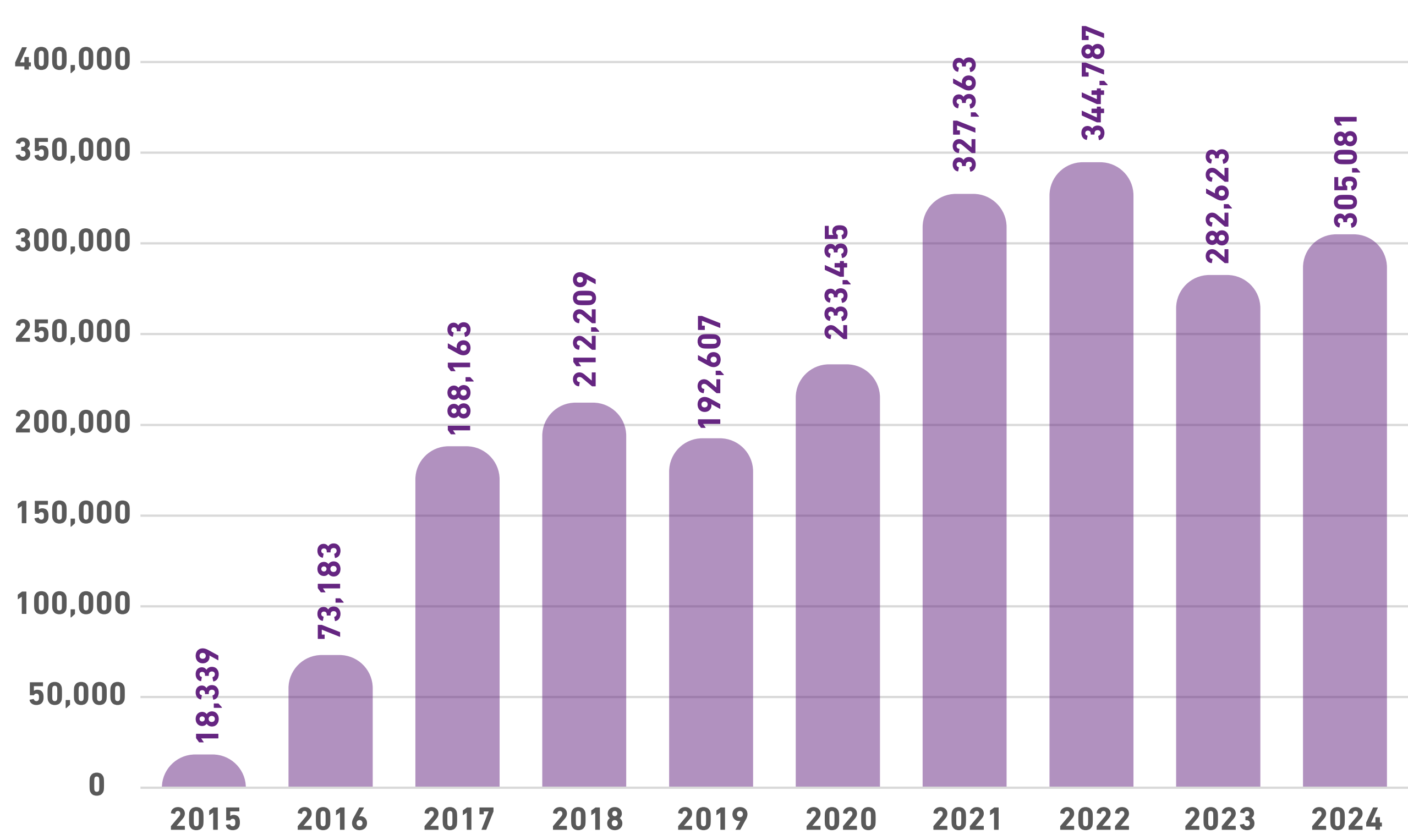


# Where Did Our Funds Come From?

In **2024**, we raised **JOD 305,081**, marking an **8%** increase from last year's **JOD 282,623**.

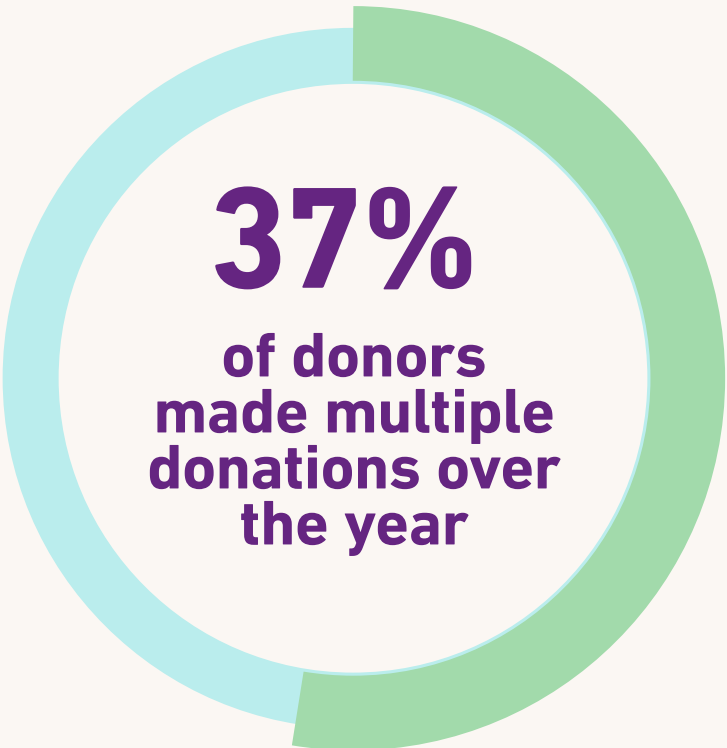

This year, private companies emerged as our second-largest donor category, contributing a total of JOD **81,500**—a **72% increase from 2023**. Of course, the discounts granted by our numerous other partner medical service providers also included many invaluable in-kind gifts worth tens of thousands of dinars.



# Capital Bank Campaign

For the second year in a row, Capital Bank has stood by Atfaluna, demonstrating its commitment to transforming children's lives. In **2024**, they generously donated **JOD 30,000**, funding **29** surgeries and ensuring that more children received the medical care they desperately needed. Their support extended beyond financial contributions: during the holy month of Ramadan, Capital Bank utilized television advertisements, billboards, and social media ads to elevate our message and expand our reach. Even more exciting, they have committed to continuing their sponsorship in **2025**.



# Hikma Pharmaceuticals

Joining hands with Atfaluna for the first time in **2024**, Hikma Pharmaceuticals made an incredible impact with a generous donation of **JOD 35,000**, some of which have already been used to fund a number of surgeries this year, and some of which will be used in **2025**. Hikma's commitment went beyond financial aid—they also supplied essential medications for medical day in Marka, extending their support to even more children in need.

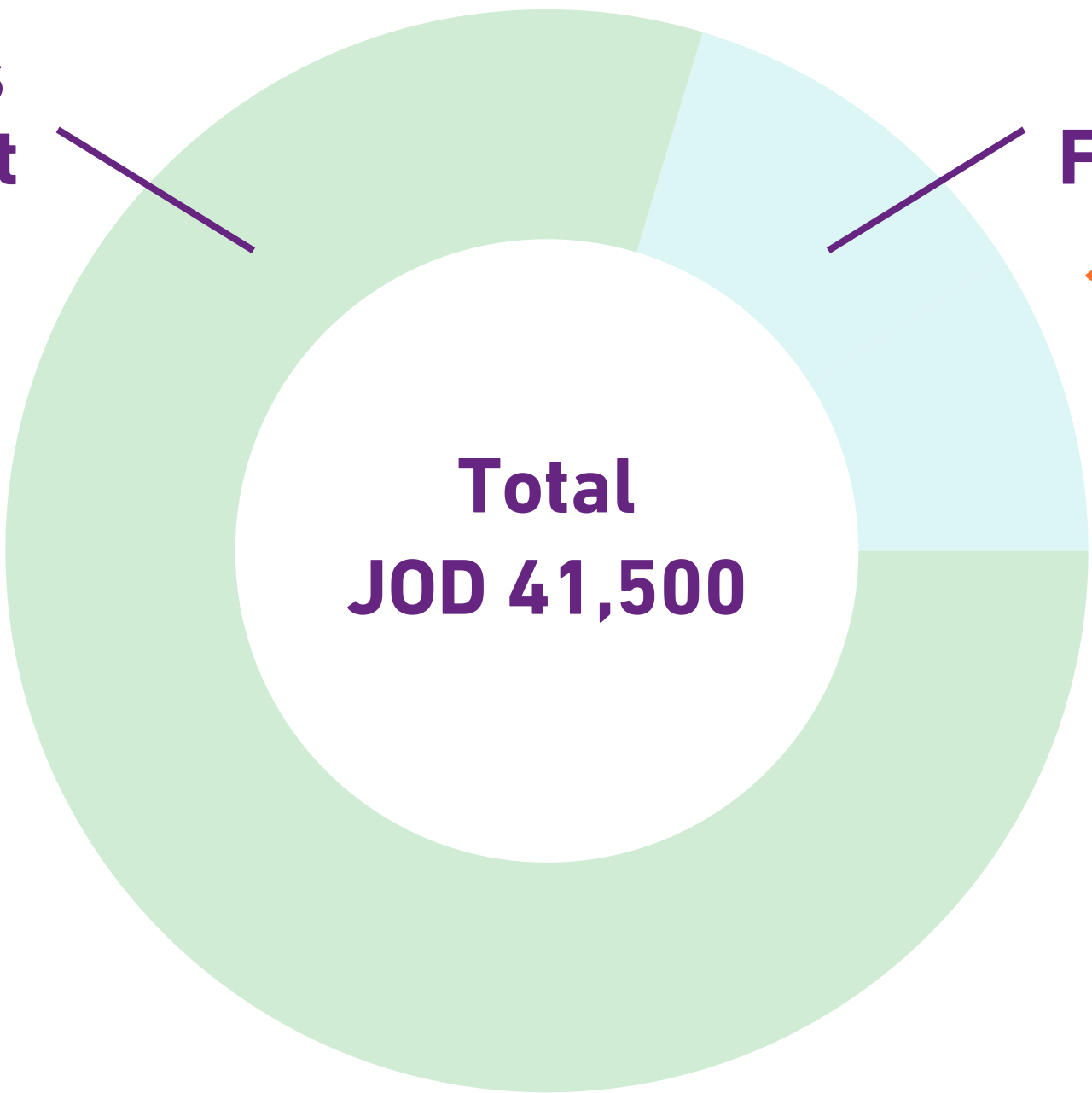

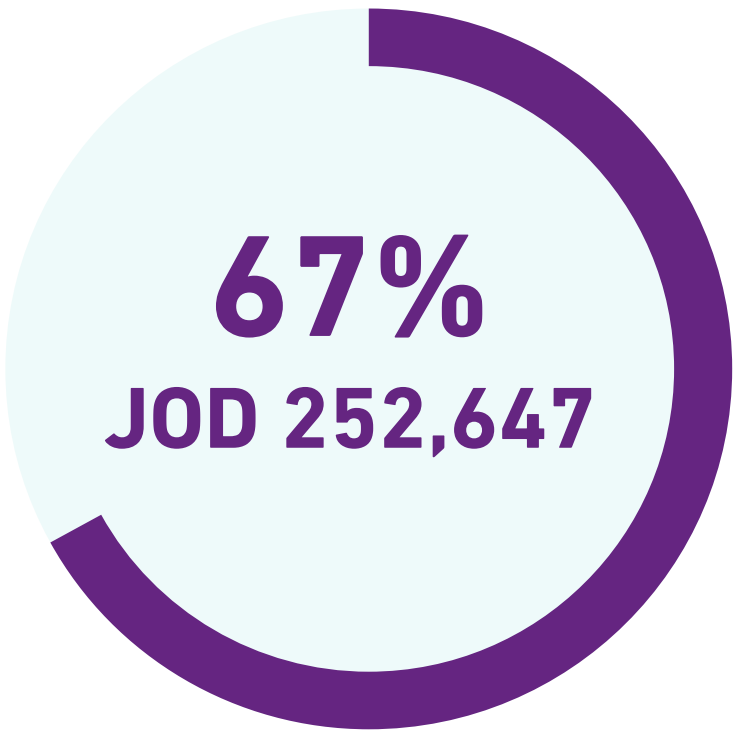
# How Were Our Funds Used?

In **2024**, our administrative expenses were **6.7%**, a low figure by any standard, mostly because a large part of Atfaluna’s work is done by volunteers. Moreover, some of our donors made donations that specifically cover administrative expenses, which means that every dinar donated by everyone else went directly towards patient care!

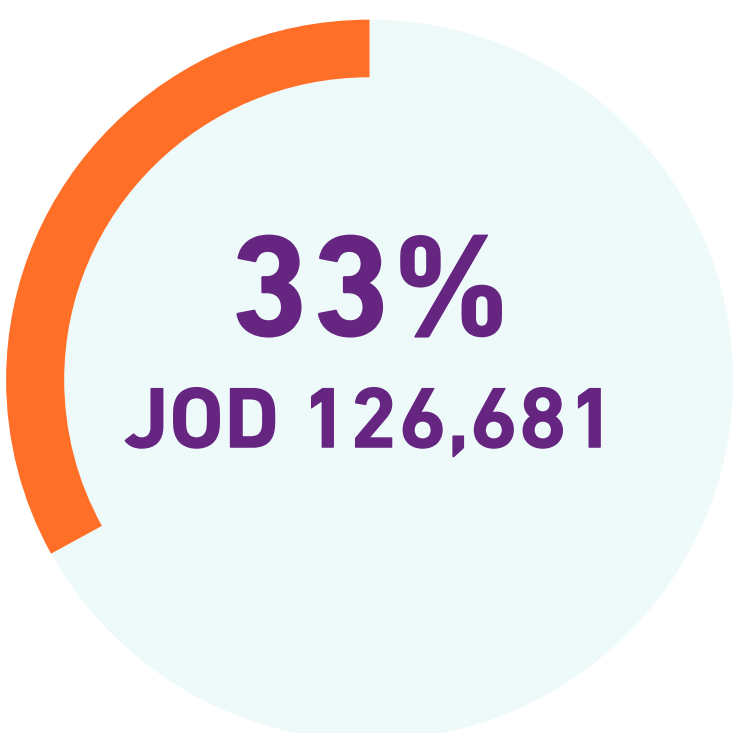
With a few exceptions, our physicians usually waive their fees entirely, and all the hospitals and medical service providers (laboratory, diagnostic imaging, etc.) with whom we work give us generous discounts, saving us in **2024** a total of **JOD 379,328**. Naturally, this all multiplies the value of every donated dinar.

This year, we financed a total of **232** surgeries. This is in addition to funding other less-invasive interventions, as well as fitting and provision of numerous medical devices and items, and hundreds of wound-care and physiotherapy sessions.

**Service-Provider Discounts**

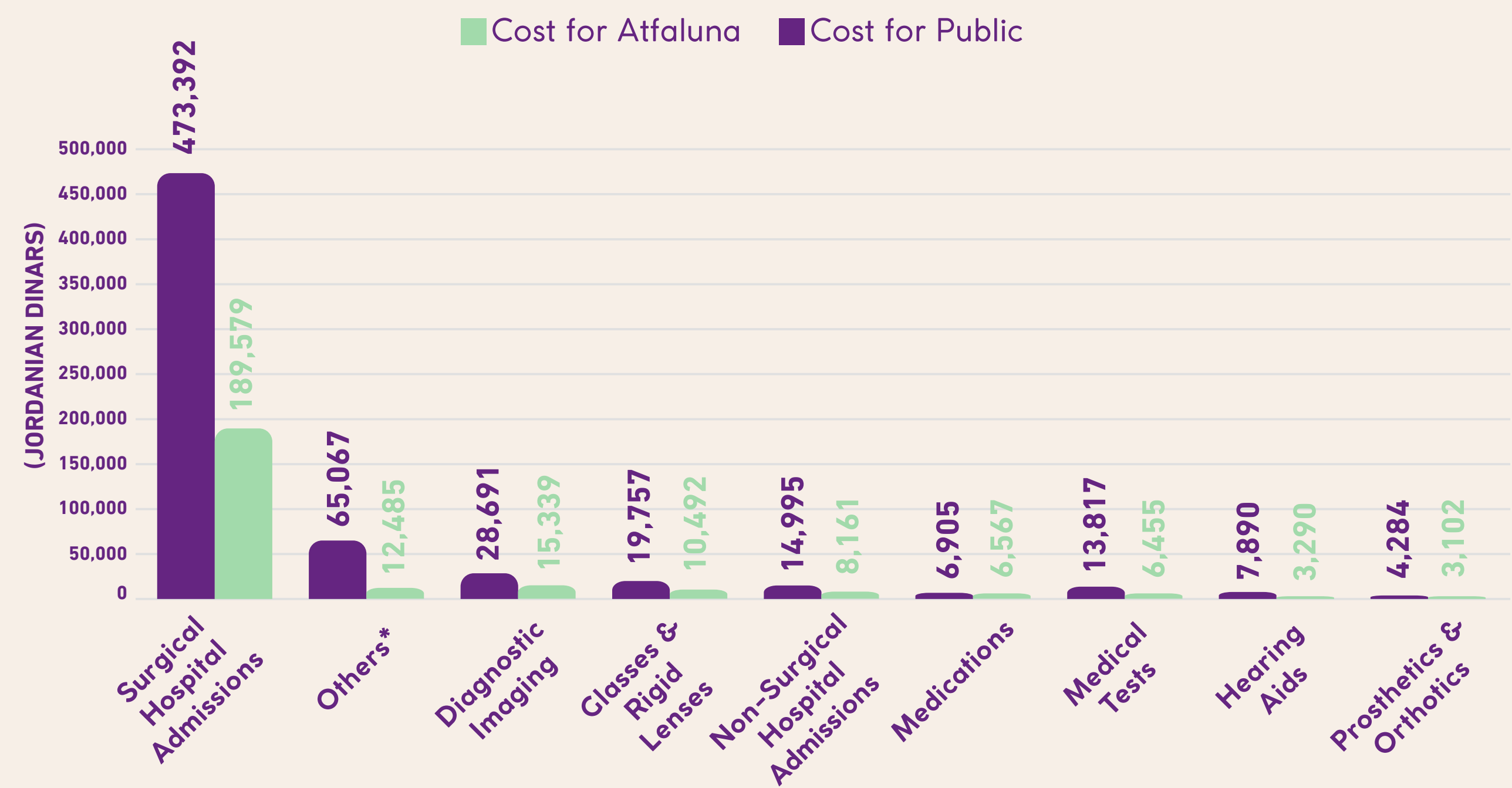

## Cost for Public vs. Cost for Atfaluna per Intervention Category



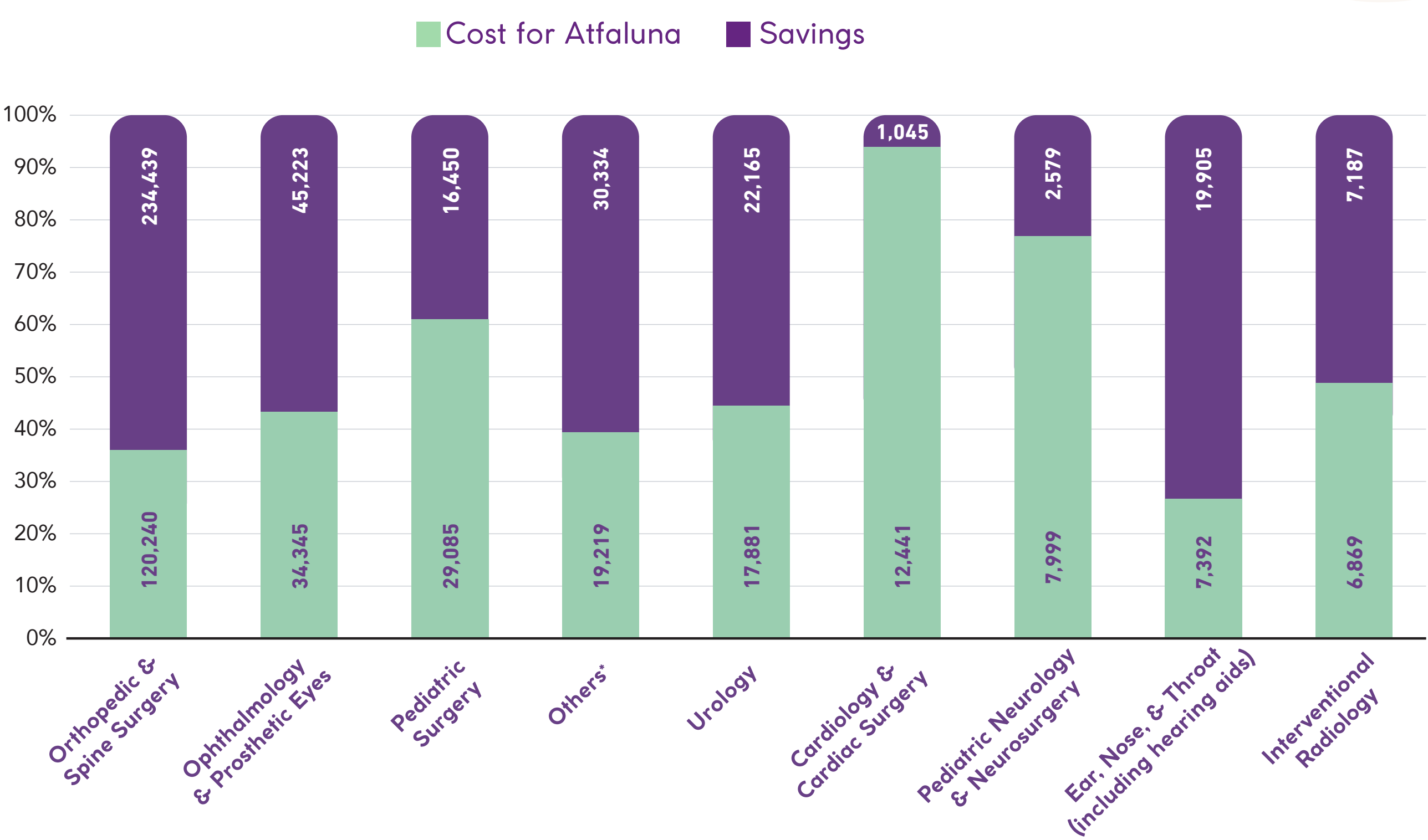

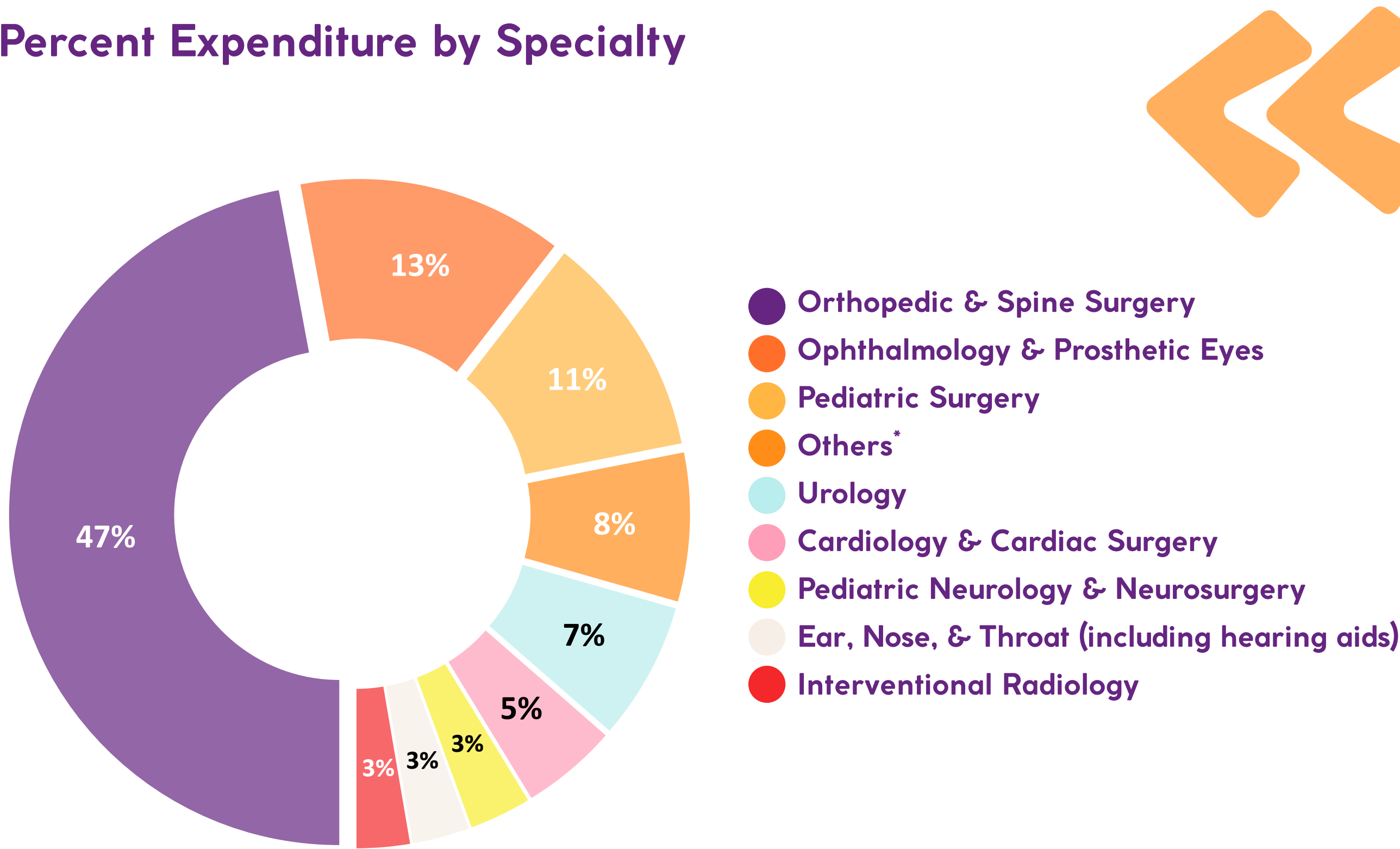

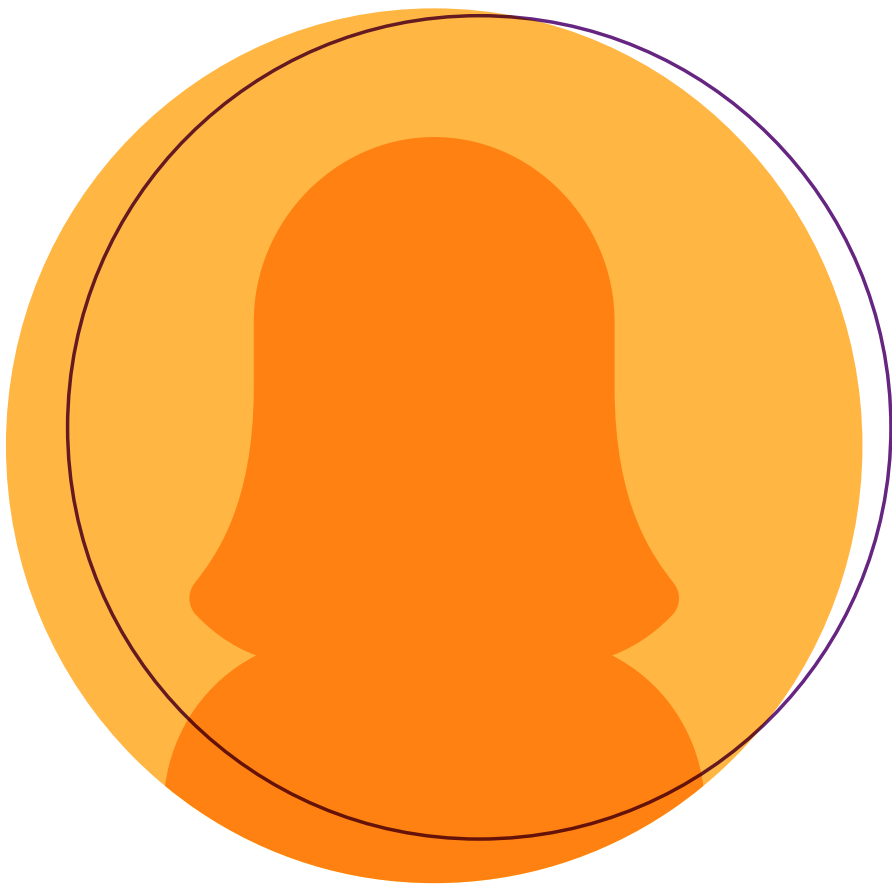
