Message From The Board

Dear friends of Atfaluna,

This year, we release our annual report with the conflicting feelings of sadness, due to the ongoing genocide and ethnic cleansing in Palestine, and pride, of Atfaluna's great accomplishments both before and since October 2023 despite the rightful redirection of much donor money into the Gaza relief efforts.

The financial challenges notwithstanding, we have managed to continue expanding our activities (see pages 13 and 19) without turning down any needy child who had passed our selection algorithm. Moreover, again this year, our administrative expenses have been fully covered by certain supporters, so that the rest of our donors can be sure that 100% of their money is going towards patient care.

In 2023, we continued our practice of carrying out "Medical Screening Days" in remote areas such as Ma'an, Karak and Dhlail (pages 14-15) to save those communities' children and their parents the trek to Amman to get a diagnosis and treatment plan for their various ailments. We also organized several "Special Campaigns," such as the Cardiac Surgery and the Cardiac Catheterization Campaigns (see page 16).

With the recruitment of new volunteer healthcare providers, we have been able not only to expand our operations (in terms of numbers treated and specialty areas), but also to take some load off our existing heroes who have been treating our patients selflessly for years. A huge thank you to those volunteers, new and old, as well as to all our donors and supporters. And if you are still getting familiar with Atfaluna and would like to know how you could partake in our hugely gratifying project, feel free to look at pages 36 and 38 of this report.

Maria – 2 years old

Maria underwent a surgical intervention for her developmental dysplasia of the hip. The procedure was performed by **Dr. Mohammad Abu Hilal**, who waived all his surgeon's fees, at **Ibn Al-Haitham Hospital**, which routinely gives us generous discounts. Maria is now recovering well and hoping to be able to walk normally without the need for any further interventions.

About Atfaluna

Atfaluna at a Glance

In 2015, a group of volunteers working in various professions came together and founded this non-profit organization the name of which means "Our Children." Together, with your support and the help of a large and growing group of volunteers, we have since been able to achieve that goal successfully for thousands of children, helping assure not only their health but also their dignity and future.

Our Objective

Helping needy children, regardless of their origin, in receiving the quality medical care that they deserve yet their families cannot afford, thus improving their health and giving them a brighter future.

The Way We Operate

Socio-Economic Assessment

A child's story begins with our social-work team, who runs a detailed initial socio-economic assessment to confirm true need.

Medical Committee Evaluation

The file then moves rapidly to the next phase, which is the Medical Committee's evaluation, and if the case fulfills its medical selection criteria the child is referred for evaluation and treatment by one of our volunteer specialists. The specialists we work with are among Jordan's best, as we strongly believe our children should receive the same level of care accessible to any other more-fortunate child.

Fundraising

Once the evaluating physician draws up the child's treatment plan, it is our Fundraising Committee's turn to raise the funds needed to make that plan a reality.

Treatment Journey

Then the treatment journey begins, and it does not end before our child's treatment and follow up have been fully completed and the child's life is as free as can be of pain and disability.

Our Patient-Selection Algorithm

Atfaluna aims to provide medical care for every child who needs it; yet to optimize the utilization of our finite resources, our Medical Committee uses the following two-step algorithm to help us prioritize our patients in an equitable manner:

Initial Screening Criteria



Age 18 years or younger



Non-malignant, non-chronic condition



Fulfillment of socio-economic pre-screening criteria



Lack of coverage by any insurance company or other NGO, unless desired treatment is urgent and waiting period for alternative coverage is deemed unreasonably long.

Weighted Selection Criteria



Threat to life



Urgency of treatment



Impact on child's quality of life



Complication risk

Each criterion is assigned a weighted score, and the patient's total score is calculated. If the total score exceeds our cutoff, the case is selected, and the child's treatment journey with Atfaluna begins.

Who We Are

Atfaluna's paid employees consist of our Senior Operations Manager, **Ms. Manal Shreiteh**, along with our Accounting & Administrative Officer, **Mrs. Muna Freij**, and our Social Workers, **Ms. Batool Mohsen**, **Ms. Lama Al-Shalalfa**, and **Ms. Zamzam Al-Raoush**.

Besides the critical roles played by our above salaried team, all the other tasks performed in the day-to-day planning and execution of our work are done by volunteers. Our "core team" of volunteers consists of a group of professionals with their own full-time jobs who work tirelessly, *pro bono* in the below-mentioned committees, together with a larger pool of "field volunteers" who eagerly step up to help out whenever help is required.

Atfaluna's strategy is developed, and its implementation is followed up, by the Management Board, which is led by our Planning Officer, **Eng. Muna Budairi**. As for the preservation of Atfaluna's core values and mission, that is the responsibility of our Board of Trustees – **Dr. Ghassan Alami**, **Mrs. Bana Fahmawi**, **Ms. Suhair Fahmawi**, **Eng. Safa Jarrar**, **Mr. Fadi Sunna'**, and **Eng. Maisa Thweib**.





Dr. Shaher Sa'diddeen, who waived part of his fees, gave her a custom-made prosthetic to help her eye socket grow and her eye to develop normally.






Financials

Where Did Our Funds Come From?

In 2023, we raised **JOD 282,623**, marking an **18% decrease** from last year's **JOD 344,787**. This decline was of course purely due to the genocide in Gaza, which understandably redirected donors' resources towards supporting the people of Gaza. Fortunately, that did not slow down the growth of our operations, for, as the next section shows, **the number of surgeries done for our children increased by 48%**.

Individuals

The majority (**72%**) of our donations were contributed by our community of generous individual donors, totaling **462 individuals**. Of those, **29% (136 donors)** made **multiple donations** during the year, while **9%** gave **JOD 1,000 or more**.

As with other similar organizations, we always encourage our supporters to make **REGULAR DONATIONS**. That is especially easy now with the various means that are available for making **digital payment**. Many of our donors have set up **automated monthly transfers** of a percentage of their salary to minimize the apparent burden of their donation.

Private Companies

This year, Private Companies emerged as our second largest donor category, contributing a total of **JOD 47,380**. Of course, the discounts granted by our numerous other partner medical service providers also included many invaluable in-kind gifts, translating into thousands of dinars.

Capital Bank

Our new partner, Capital Bank, stepped into the spotlight with a generous donation of **JOD 30,000** to cover the costs of **31 surgeries**. Their support extended beyond financial backing, strategically amplifying Atfaluna's mission through a **media campaign**. With television advertisements, street billboards, and social media posts during the holy month of Ramadan, Capital Bank has amplified our message, and enhanced our reach. Better yet, they have promised to continue sponsoring Atfaluna in 2024.



Tamam Foods

Tamam Foods, our other new partner, creatively supported Atfaluna by adding a flavorful twist to our fundraising efforts. Throughout December 2022, January, February, and March of 2023, for every fillet pack sold, **they donated 3 piasters**, resulting in a total donation of **JOD 5,565**. Additionally, they included a sticker on each pack featuring Atfaluna's logo, ensuring that our message spread far and wide with every bite.




MedLabs

This loyal partner gave us a **JOD 2,000** in-kind donation of medical tests, which is an **ANNUAL gift** we have received, along with a **standing 55% discount** on all tests done at any of MedLabs' branches, since we co-signed a memorandum of understanding in **2019**.



Foundations and Family Trusts

This year, donations from foundations and family trusts amounted to **JOD 31,645**, received from 3 different trusts.



Non-Profit Organizations

The **JOD 1,146** received from non-profit organizations was donated by Life Makers. These funds were earmarked for the treatment of patients sent to Atfaluna by **Life Makers** in order to benefit from our operational setup, provider network, and special discounts.

Our Memorial Funds Program

Be it to honor a family member or friend, or to fund the treatment of a particular medical problem, we offer donors the option of setting up **permanent** funds to which they and others can contribute on a **regular** basis.

Three such funds have so far been set up, one in memory of the late **Dr. Basheer Y. Alami**, another in memory of the late **Maha M. Al-Amir** (one of our founding members who passed away in 2021), and the most recent fund established in memory of the late **Abdulraheem and Naseem Jardaneh**.

She therefore underwent a two-stage corrective surgery, performed at **Al-Israa' Hospital** by **Dr. Akram Al-Shobaki** (who always waives his fees entirely), and is now standing and walking well without the frequent falls she used to suffer from.


How were your Donations Spent?

In 2023, our administrative expenses were **4.4%**, a very low figure by any standard, mostly because a large part of Atfaluna's work is done by volunteers. Moreover, some of our donors took care of covering **ALL of our administrative expenses, which means that every dinar donated by everyone else went directly towards patient care!**

With a few exceptions, our physicians usually waive their fees entirely, and all the hospitals and medical service providers (laboratory, diagnostic imaging, etc.) with whom we work give us generous discounts, saving us in 2023 a total of **JOD 484,131**. Naturally, this all multiplies the value of every donated dinar.

This year, we financed a total of **292 surgeries**, marking a significant increase of **48%** compared to the **197 surgeries** covered last year. This is in addition to funding other less-invasive interventions, as well as fitting and provision of numerous medical devices and items, and hundreds of wound-care and physiotherapy sessions.



Cost For Public vs. Cost For Atfaluna Per Intervention Category




Expenditure Per Specialty

Cost for Atfaluna Per Specialty vs. Savings




Percent Expenditure Per Specialty

And with God's grace and the efforts of these two amazing doctors (both of whom always waive their fees entirely), Ibraheem is now better and has been saved from kidney failure.





Future Directions

As we step into 2024, Atfaluna remains dedicated to its mission of providing free medical care to underprivileged children in Jordan. Our goals for the coming year are structured to build on our past achievements while expanding our reach and services in meaningful ways:

"Children are provided with quality healthcare, served in a timely manner, and treated by the most appropriate medical providers in a dignified manner until the end of their recovery."

1. Continue to plan incoming international missions to cover our children's needs in areas where local expertise is absent or insufficient, namely certain orthopedic surgeries and heart surgeries.
2. Optimize our efficiency in providing certain common surgeries through the implementation of more frequent "surgical campaigns" for groups of similar cases.
3. Automate our monitoring-and-evaluation system using our new internal web app to facilitate the follow up of each child's treatment journey and its impact on his/her future.
4. Organize specialized field clinics that can be regularly available, staffed by volunteer doctors. This initiative aims to bring specialized medical care closer to communities, reducing the need for travel and providing immediate support to those in urgent need.
5. Expand our network to include more sub-specialists, especially in deficit areas such as urology and ENT.
6. Support capacity building within Jordan's public health sector, emphasizing equipment provision and staff training.

"The neediest children are identified through well-defined selection criteria and targeted through a comprehensive outreach strategy in different disadvantaged communities."

7. Expand our outreach strategy to new regions and communities across Jordan to ensure maximum reach and coverage.
8. Increase the frequency of "medical screening days" in remote areas to provide essential services on the ground, thus saving families the arduous journey to Amman.

9. Strengthen partnerships and referral mechanisms with other organizations to create a more cohesive network of support.

"Ensuring that more children have access to sustained medical care and support."

10. Expand our network to include more healthcare institutions and HCPs to relieve some load off our existing partners.
11. Ensure well-organized support for our increasing number of patients and MSPs from our dynamic and growing pool of volunteers.
12. Continue strengthening corporate fundraising and improve the process of updating donors to demonstrate the specific impact and value of their donations.
13. Diversify fundraising approaches and payment methods to ensure flexibility and accessibility for all donors.
14. Elevate and engagement across all platforms, reinforcing our mission and achievements to a broader audience.
15. Augment the size and capacity of our Communications team.
16. Finalize the design and operation of our new website.
17. Increase the utilization of various media types and levels (digital and traditional) to enhance public visibility and participation in our cause.
18. Continue strengthening and institutionalizing our different committees, with systematization of their operations.
19. Last but not least, offering our network and resources to any of Gaza's refugees who might be allowed into Jordan to receive medical care, provided they, like all our other beneficiaries, are found to be needy and do not already have coverage from other organizations.

We are excited about the path that lies ahead for 2024. Our initiatives, including the new specialized field clinics, are designed to deepen our impact and bring us closer to a future where every child in need receives the care they deserve. We look forward to sharing with you the stories of hope and healing that your support makes possible.


