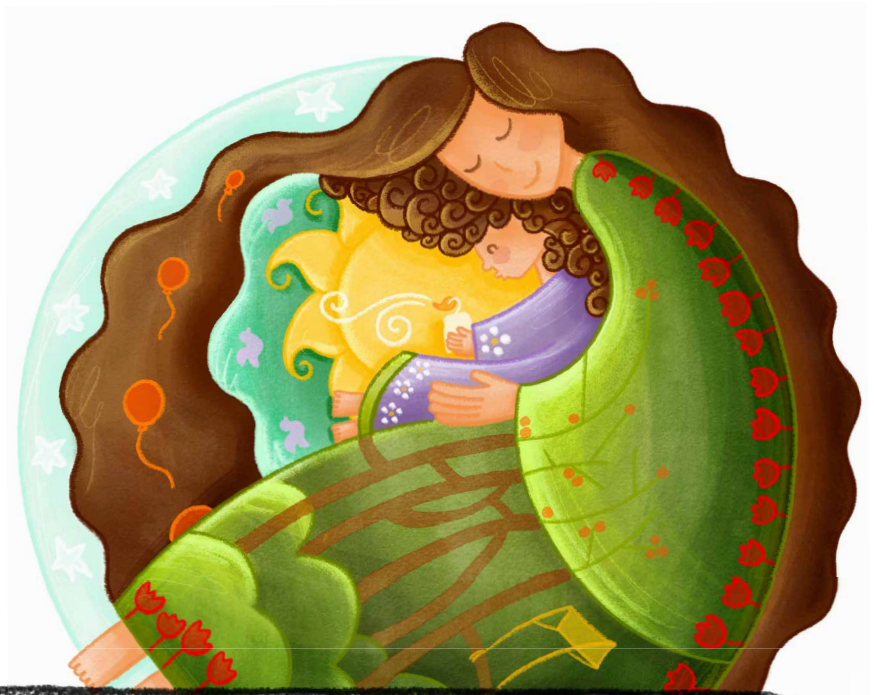

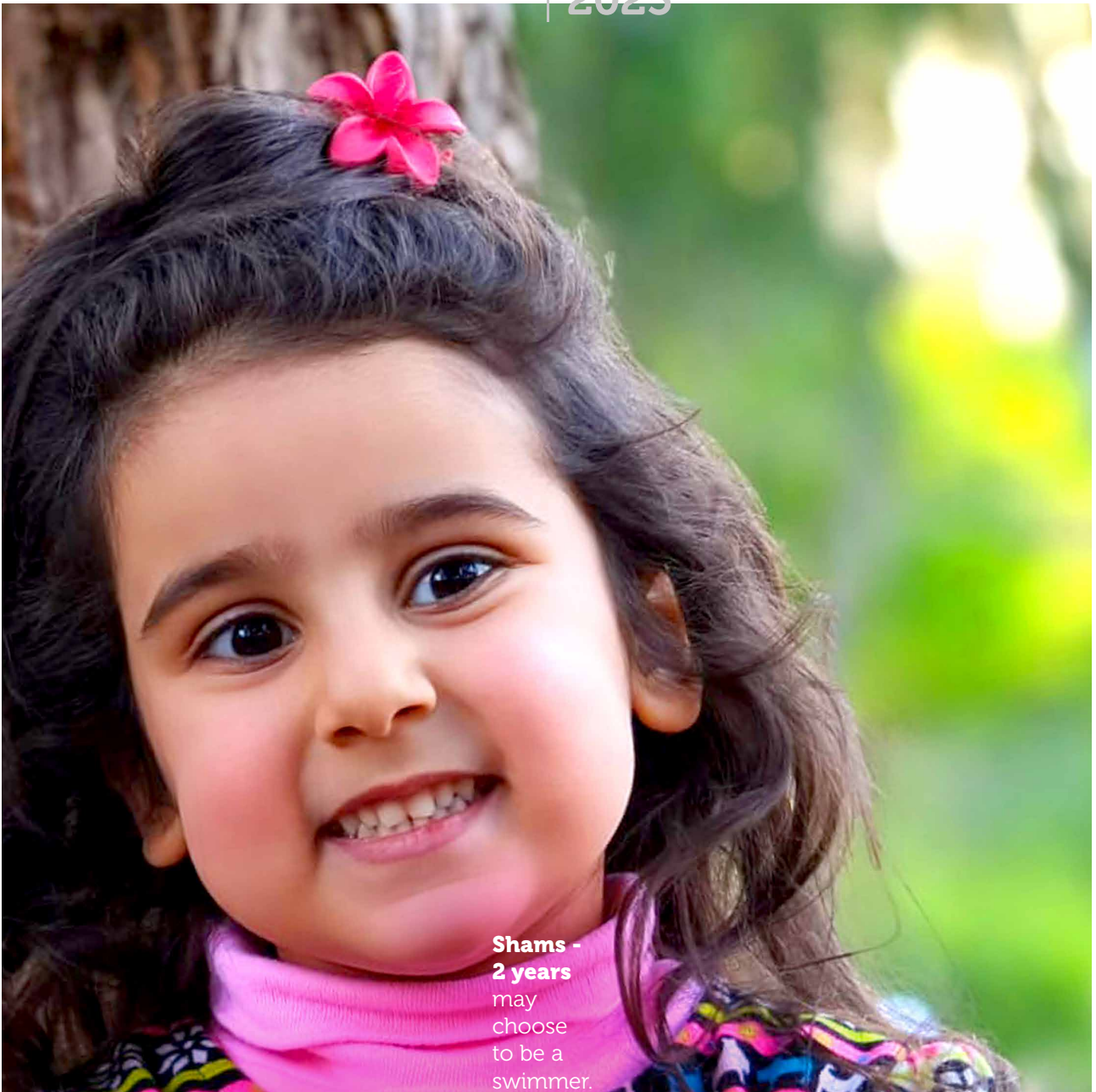


Shams was born with a heart defect that affected her breathing and energy.

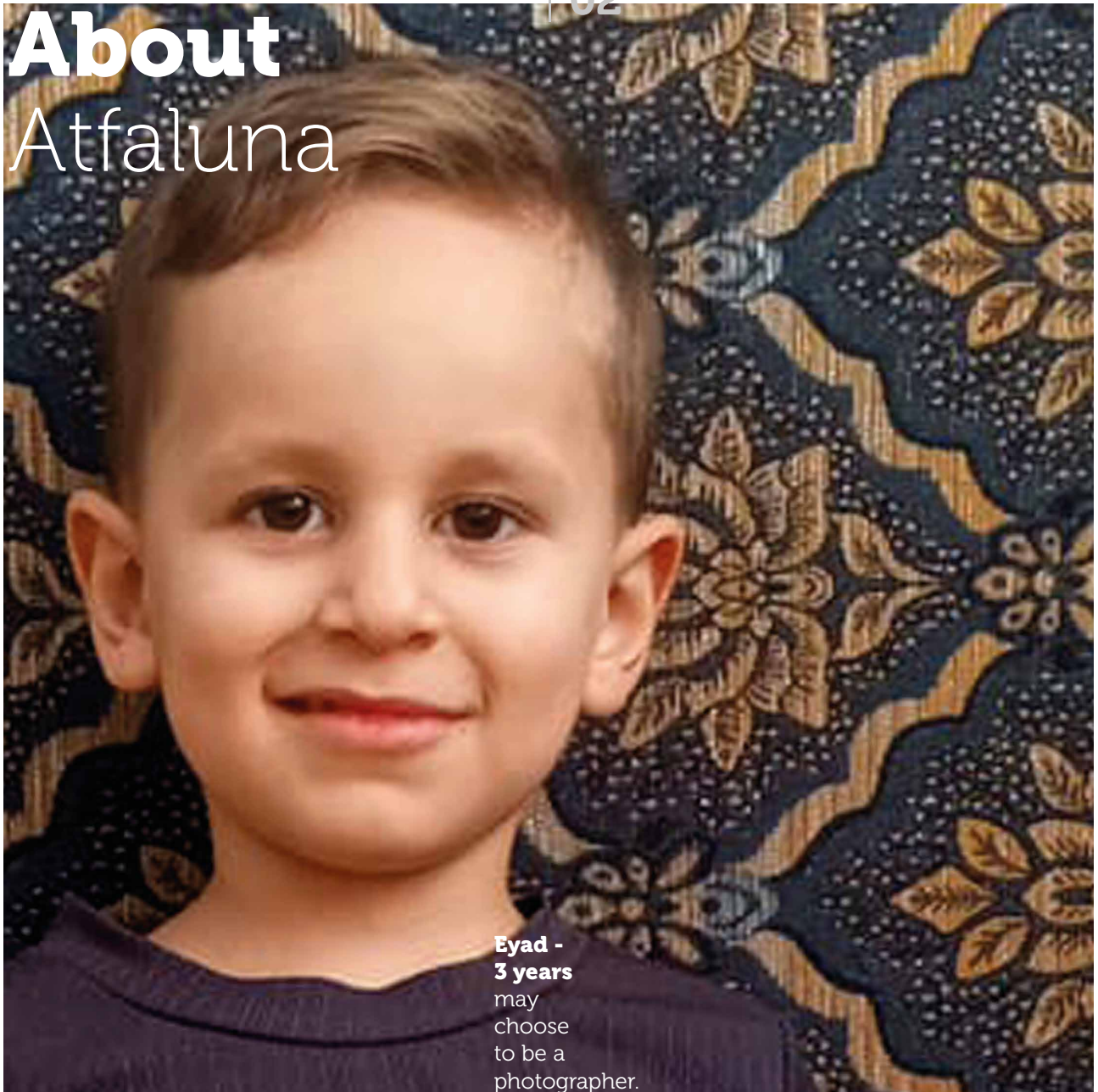

The procedure was done successfully at the **Middle East Eye Hospital**, and with it Dr. Uday was able to restore Iyad's eye sight back to normal.


Atfaluna in a Glimpse

The Way We Operate

Socio-Economic Assessment



A child's story begins with our social-work team, who runs a detailed initial socio-economic assessment to confirm true need.

Medical Committee Evaluation



The file then moves rapidly to the next phase, which is the Medical Committee's evaluation, and if the case fulfills its medical selection criteria the child is referred for evaluation and treatment by one of our volunteer specialists. The specialists we work with are among Jordan's best, as we strongly believe our children should receive the same level of care accessible to any other more-fortunate child.

Fundraising



Once the evaluating physician draws up the child's treatment plan, it is our Fundraising Committee's turn to raise the funds needed to make that plan a reality.

Treatment Journey



Then the treatment journey begins, and it does not end before our child's treatment and follow up have been fully completed and the child's life is as free as can be of pain and disability.

Our Patient Selection Algorithm

Atfaluna aims to provide medical care for every child who needs it; yet to optimize the utilization of our finite resources, our Medical Committee uses the following two-step algorithm to help us prioritize our patients in an equitable manner:


Pre-Screening Criteria

- Age 18 years or younger
- Non-malignant, non-chronic condition
- Fulfillment of socio-economic pre-screening criteria
- Lack of coverage by any insurance company or other NGO, unless desired treatment is urgent and waiting period for alternative coverage is deemed unreasonably long.

Weighted Selection Criteria

- Threat to life
- Urgency of treatment
- Impact on child's quality of life
- Complication risk

Each criterion is assigned a weight, and the total score for each case is calculated. If the minimal cutoff is met, the case is selected, and the child's treatment journey with Atfaluna begins.

Who We Are



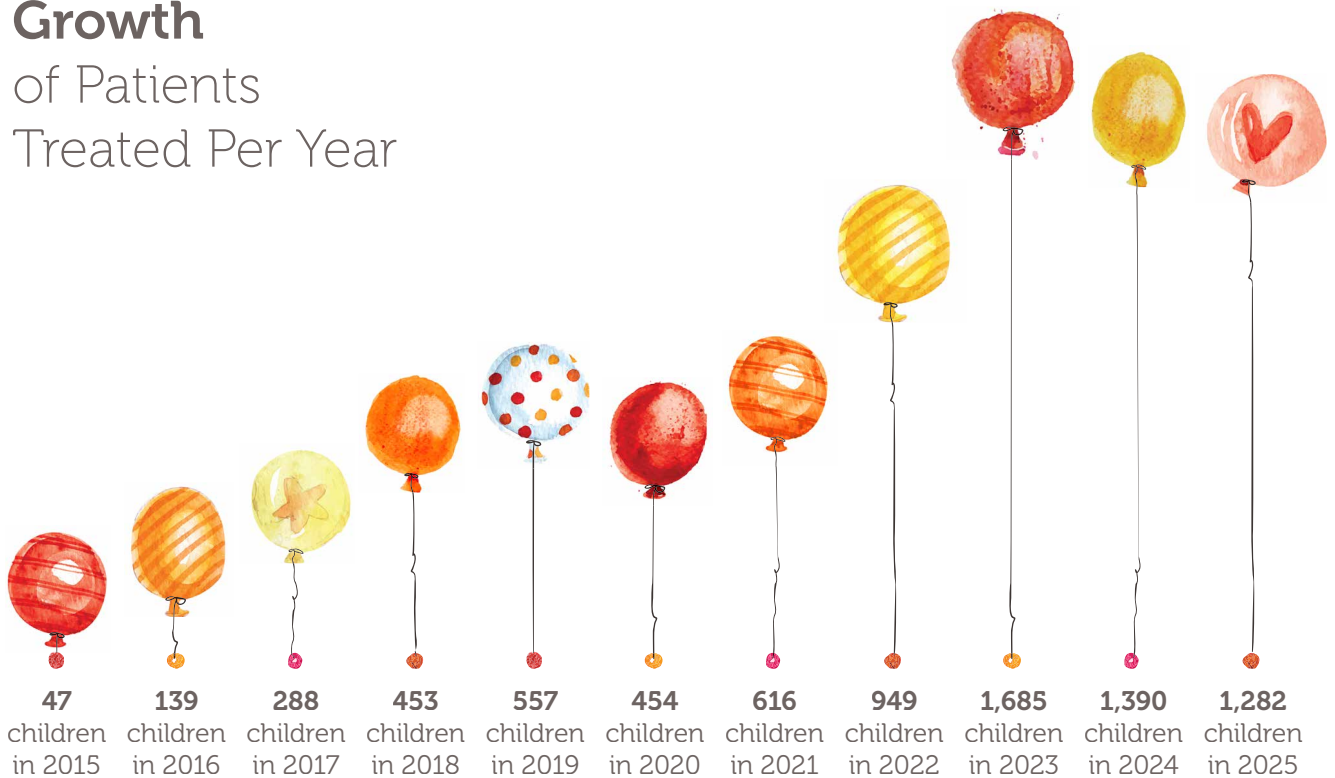

Where Did Our Funds Come From?

In 2025, we raised **JOD 366,095**, marking a **20% increase** from last year's JOD 305,081.

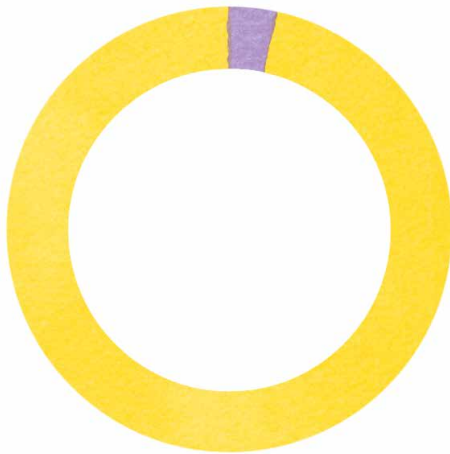

Individuals

The majority (46%) of our donations were contributed by our community of generous individual donors, totaling 607 individuals. Of those, 38.5% (234 donors) made multiple donations during the year, while 8.6% gave JOD 1,000 or more.

As with other similar organizations, we always encourage our supporters to make REGULAR DONATIONS. That is especially easy now with the various means that are available for electronic payments. Many of our donors have set up automated monthly transfers of a percentage of their salary to minimize the apparent burden of their donation.

Capital Bank Campaign

For the third consecutive year, Capital Bank has stood alongside Atfaluna as a committed long-term partner, consistently demonstrating its dedication to transforming children's lives. In 2025, the bank contributed JOD 30,000, directly funding 29 surgeries and enabling more children to access the medical care they desperately needed. Their partnership extends well beyond financial support: Capital Bank has played a pivotal role in boosting Atfaluna's mission through a comprehensive media campaign during the holy month of Ramadan. Capital Bank utilized television advertisements, billboards, and social media ads to elevate our message and expand our reach. This sustained and evolving collaboration reflects a shared vision for long-term impact, further reinforced by their continued commitment to supporting Atfaluna in 2026.

Hikma Pharmaceuticals

Continuing their partnership with Atfaluna for the second year, Hikma Pharmaceuticals made a very meaningful contribution in 2025 through a generous donation of JOD 35,000, supporting life-changing treatments for a number of children.

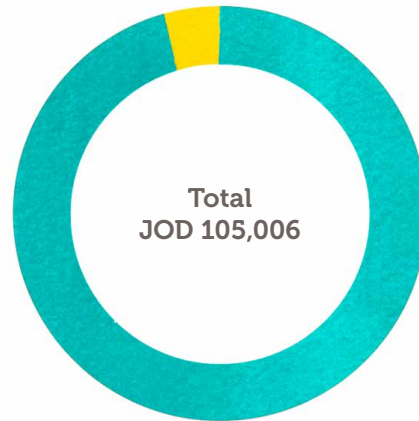
A valued returning supporter of Atfaluna, Etihad Bank renewed its commitment with a JOD 10,000 donation, directly funding the treatment of five children.

MedLabs

MedLabs, our loyal partner, provided a donation consisting of two components: JOD 2,500 as part of their annual gift to Atfaluna, coupled with a standing 55% discount on all tests conducted at any of MedLabs' branches—a benefit established since we co-signed a memorandum of understanding in 2019.

Foundations and Family Trusts

In 2025, donations from foundations and family trusts reached JOD 105,006, which is **over 2.5x** the sum of JOD 41,500 received from two trusts in the previous year. This reflects a growth of approximately 153%, highlighting the expanding confidence and engagement of institutional donors in Atfaluna's mission.

Non-Profit Organizations

In 2025, Atfaluna received a total of JOD 11,724 in contributions from non-profit organizations, reflecting continued collaboration with local charitable actors. Key contributions included support from Life Makers (JOD 6,949), Wahb Al Ghaith (JOD 3,000), and Jamiyat Al Sawsana Al Sawda Lil Aamal Al Khairiya (JOD 1,775).

Funds received from Life Makers were specifically earmarked to support the treatment of patients referred by the organization to Atfaluna, enabling them to benefit from Atfaluna's operational setup, provider network, and negotiated medical discounts.

Our Memorial Funds Program

Be it to honor a family member or friend, or to fund the treatment of a particular medical problem, we offer donors the option of setting up permanent funds to which they and others can contribute on a regular basis.

Three such funds have so far been set up, one in memory of the late **Dr. Basheer Y. Alami**, another in memory of the late **Maha M. Al-Amir** (one of our founding members who passed away in 2021), and another in memory of the late **Abdulraheem and Naseem Jardaneh**.

How Did We Use Our Funds?

In 2025, our administrative expenses were **6.4%**, a low figure by any standard, mostly because a large part of Atfaluna's work is done by volunteers. Moreover, some of our donors took care of covering ALL of our administrative expenses, which means that

every dinar donated by everyone else went directly towards patient care!

With a few exceptions, our physicians usually waive their fees entirely, and all the hospitals and medical service providers (laboratory, diagnostic imaging, etc.) with whom we work give us generous discounts, saving us in 2025 a total of JOD 313,159. Naturally, this all multiplies the value of every donated dinar.

This year, we financed a total of 267 surgeries. This is in addition to funding other less-invasive interventions, as well as fitting and provision of numerous medical devices and items, and hundreds of wound-care and physiotherapy sessions.

Sources of Our Savings



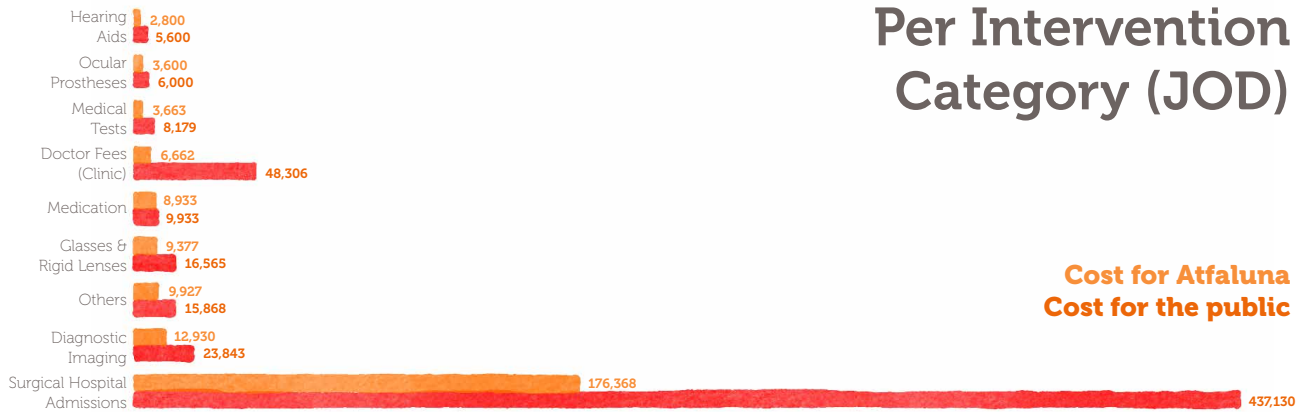

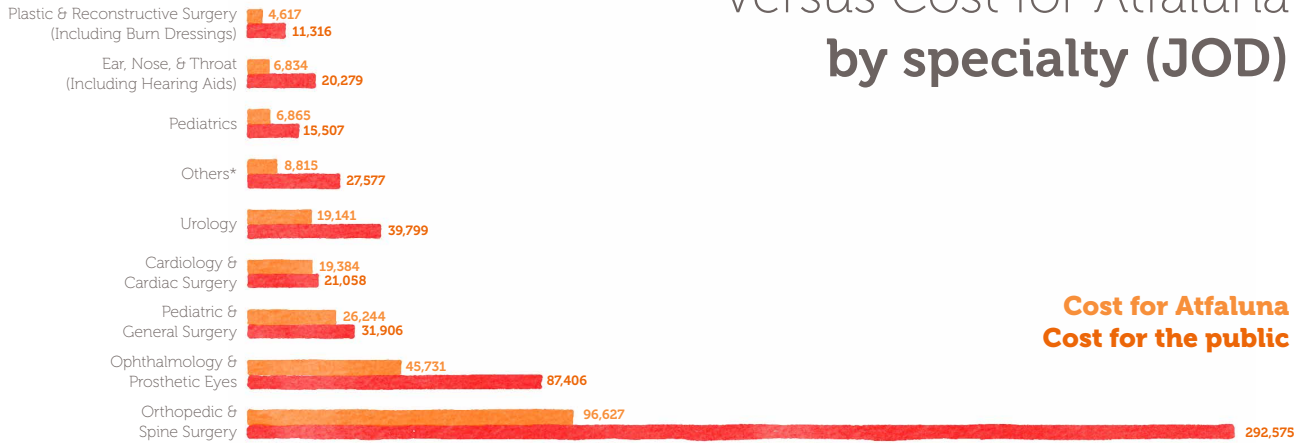

Cost for the Public Versus Cost for Atfaluna by specialty (JOD)

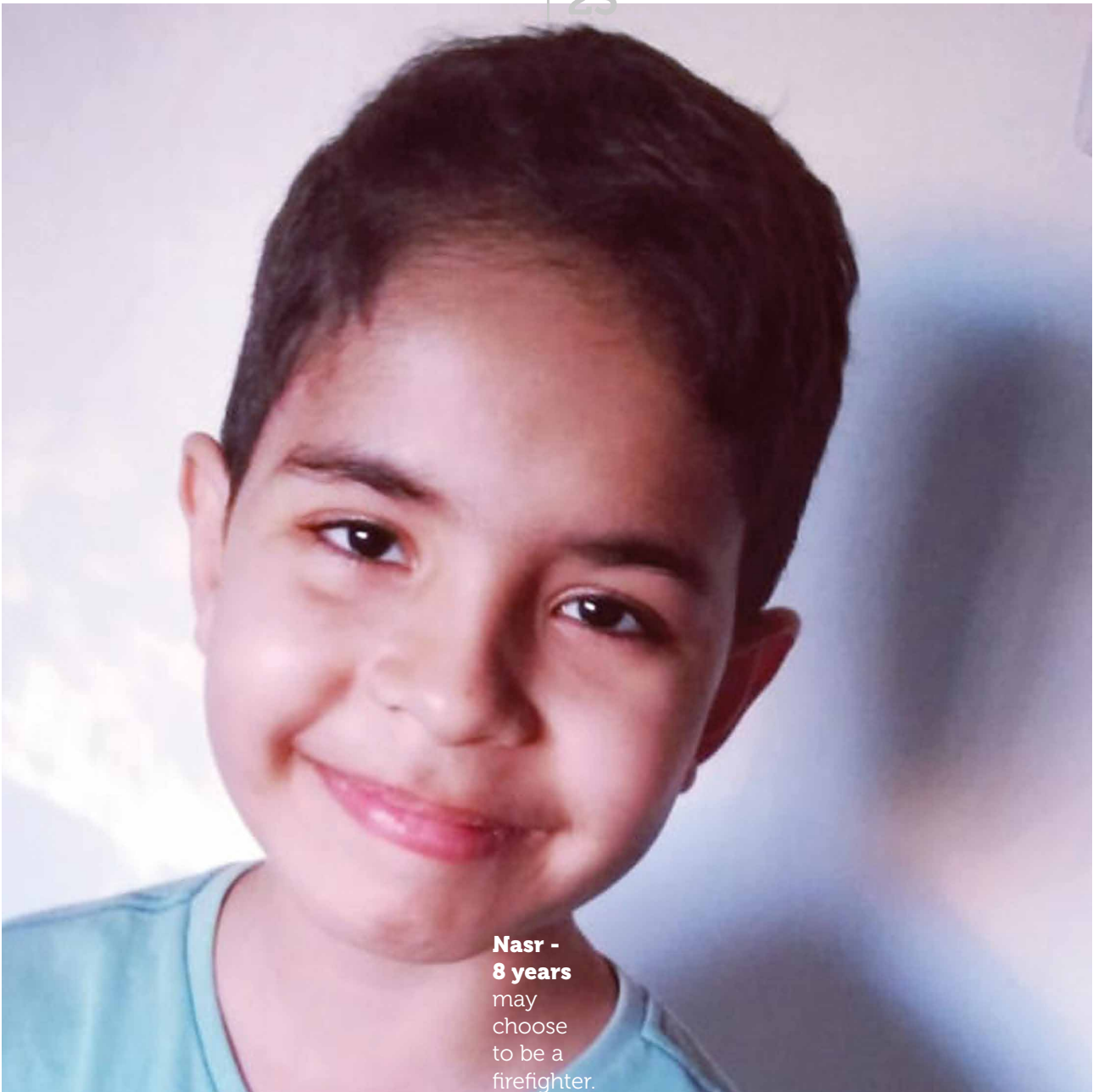

Future Directions

In 2026, Atfaluna hopes to strengthen and expand its mission by focusing on the following five strategic pillars:

Expansion of outreach and access to quality care

Atfaluna will strive to further increase the number of treated children, prioritizing complex cases and underserved regions. We will continue to strengthen partnerships with local and international organizations to expand our reach. Efforts will include more international missions in specialties with limited local capacity, additional surgical campaigns for common procedures, and expanded medical screening days to bring expert care closer to remote communities.

Public-sector capacity building & raising of community-health awareness

We hope to increase our involvement in public sector capacity building through equipment provision, staff training, and streamlined referral pathways. Atfaluna will also work on enhancing community-health education to encourage early diagnosis and reduce delays in seeking care through engaging families, schools, and community leaders.

Strengthening of humanitarian responsiveness

Whenever Gaza's injured children are granted entry to Jordan for medical care, Atfaluna stands ready to mobilize its network to support them—guided by the same principles of equity and need that underpin all its programs, and hoping to contribute to alleviating the immense suffering that this specific population continues to endure.

Bolstering of fundraising & communications

Atfaluna will continue to diversify its fundraising channels, strengthen corporate partnerships, and enhance donor engagement. We also plan to increase our visibility across digital and traditional media, grow our communications team, and maintain our website to better showcase impact and facilitate donor interaction.

Tracking of patient journeys, reporting their outcomes, & assessing impact

A key priority for 2026 is further optimizing the use of Atfaluna's recently completed web application to ensure accurate tracking of each child's medical journey and enable even better reporting of treatment outcomes. This would automatically facilitate the sharing of updates with both our caregivers and our donors about their efforts and donations' real impact on our children's lives.

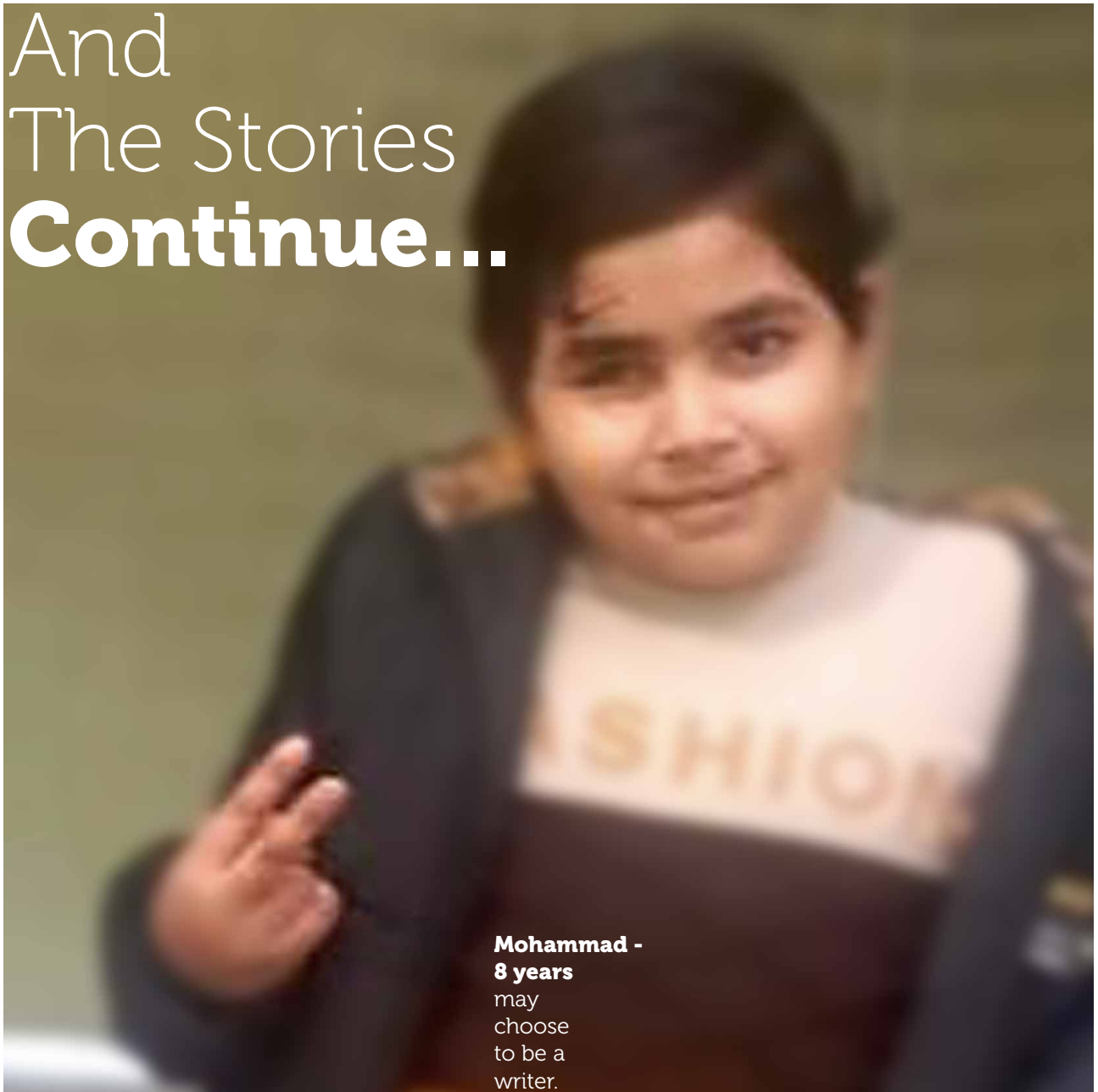
